Prague's Remarkable Landmarks and Monuments

- Prague Castle (Pražský hrad)**
Prague 1 – Hradčany
The world's largest castle complex. Since its establishment in the 9th century, it has continuously developed over 12 centuries. Originally the seat of Bohemian princes and kings, it has been home to the president since 1918. Its most important accessible buildings are: Old Royal Palace, the St. Vitus, St. Wenceslas and St. Adalbert Cathedrals, the Basilica of St. George, the Chapel of the Holy Cross with the St. Vitus Treasury, the Mihulka Powder Tower, Golden Lane and – in summer – the Royal Garden with the Ball Games Hall and the Royal Summer Palace.
- Strahov Monastery (Strahovský klášter)**
Prague 1, Strahovské nádvorní 1/132
Founded in 1140 and originally a monastery of the Premonstratensian Order, it includes the Strahov Gallery, the Monastic Library with the Baroque Theological Hall and Philosophical Hall (valuable mural paintings) and the Church of the Assumption of Our Lady.
- The Dancing House (Tančící dům)**
Prague 2, Rašínovo nábřeží 80
This office building from 1994–1996 was designed by the local architect Vlado Milunic and the world-renowned architect and designer Frank O. Gehry. The controversial waterfront building was named after the shape of its towers, which symbolize the famous dance partners Ginger Rogers and Fred Astaire: the male figure is represented by the concrete tower while its glass "partner" symbolizes the female figure.
- Petrín Lookout Tower (Petrínská rozhledna)**
Prague 1, Petrínské sady
On a hill near the city centre stand this 60-metre iron tower, erected as part of the General Land Centennial Exhibition in 1891 as a smaller copy of the Eiffel Tower in Paris, and a pavilion with a maze of mirrors. A unique Funicular has been carrying passengers to the peak for over a century.
- St. Nicholas Church (Kostel sv. Mikuláša)**
Prague 1, Národní 2
One of the most important buildings from Prague's Baroque period. Featuring a commanding dome and bell tower, it was built in 1704–1756 by architect K. Dientzenhofer. The interior boasts huge frescoes with scenes from the life of St. Nicholas.
- Charles Bridge and Bridge Towers (Karlův most)**
Prague 1, Malá Strana – Staré Město
Prague's oldest bridge was founded in 1357 by Charles IV and completed in 1402 under the supervision of Peter Parler. It is fortified by towers on both sides. Since 1683, 30 statues and groups of statues of saints have been set on the bridge's pillars.
- Old Town Square (Staroměstské náměstí)**
Prague 1, Staroměstské náměstí
This square is the real heart of Prague. The Old Town Hall complex comprises a 70m tower and three adjoining buildings, but the biggest attraction is the Astronomical Clock where wooden statues of the 12 apostles parade every hour; the lower part features a calendar with the signs of the zodiac by Josef Mánes (1865). The Danish astronomer Tycho Brahe is buried in the Church of Our Lady Before Týn on the other side of the square.

Josefov – Jewish Town

- Prague 1 – The Castle (Hrad)**
The wonderful old synagogues located in today's Josefov show that Prague was an important centre of the Central European Jewish community. The oldest and most beautiful is the Old New Synagogue, which boasts massive brick gables. The story goes that the building contains the mythical Golem, which according to ancient legend was created by Rabbi Loew; he is buried at the Old Jewish Cemetery.
- Municipal House (Obecní dům)**
Prague 1, Náměstí Republiky 5
Art Nouveau building from 1905–1911. Its outstanding external and internal decorations were created by the most significant artists of the day, specifically A. Mucha, M. Svabinský, J. V. Myslík and J. Preisler. The imposing Smetana Hall is used for important festivals, concerts and social events.
- Powder Tower (Prašná brána)**
Prague 1, Na Příkopě
A late Gothic structure from 1475 built by Matěj Rejsek.
- Infant Jesus of Prague, Church of Our Lady Victorious (Pražské jezulátko, Kostel P. Marie Vítězné)**
Prague 1, Karmelitská
The Child of Prague is a wax statuette donated in 1628 by Potemkin to Lobkowitz. It is located in the Church of Our Lady Victorious, which also houses a collection of outfits that the figure is dressed in according to the liturgy.
- National Theatre (Národní divadlo)**
Prague 1, Letenská ulice
The neo-Renaissance structure was built as a symbol of the National Revival in 1868–1881 by the architect J. Zitek and reconstructed after a fire in 1881–1883. Thanks to its gold ornamentation, this theatre on the banks of the Vltava is known as the 'golden chapel'. The National Theatre also comprises the Laterna Magika, which combines film, dance, music, light effects and mime.
- Vyšehrad (Vyšehrad)**
Prague 2, V Pevnosti
According to legend, Vyšehrad was the seat of the first Czech princes. In reality, however, this fortress dates back to the 10th century. In the complex you can admire the Romanesque Rotunda of St. Martin, Gothic callars, cassettes, a museum, the Church of SS Peter and Paul and the nearby cemetery Slavín, where the most honoured persons of the Czech nation are buried.

Prague Gardens and Parks

- Prague Castle Gardens (Zahrady Pražského hradu)**
Prague 1, Valdštejnská 12–14
The Royal Garden (Královská zahrada) was created in 1534 and developed under the inspiration of Italian design. It was modified with various elements of garden architecture in the 16th century as the Royal Summer Residence (also sometimes known as Belvedere). Early in the 18th century, the garden was remodelled in the Baroque style; many sculptures created in M. B. Braun's workshop were installed there and have been preserved to this day. At the end of the 18th century, the garden underwent redevelopment into an English-styled landscape park and later, in the 19th century, most of its fruit trees were replaced with ornamental trees.
- Southern Gardens (Jižní zahrady) – Rajská (Paradise Garden), Na Valech (Garden on the Ramparts), Hartigovy zahrady (Hartig Garden), The Southern Gardens**
The Southern Gardens are located beneath the arches of the southern side of Prague Castle. Originally laid out in the 16th century, the Paradise Garden received its current look from Jože Plečnik in the 1920s. The architect also redesigned the Garden on the Ramparts, a former natural park. The Hartig Garden, which contains a Music Pavilion, was added to the garden compound in the mid 20th century.
- Palace Gardens beneath Prague Castle (Palačové zahrady pod Pražským hradem)**
Prague 1, Letenská ulice
The Ledeburg, Small and Great Palfy, Kolowrat and Small Fürstenberg terraced gardens lie on the southern slope below Prague Castle. The site of today's gardens was for many years home to a defence system. However, in the 16th century the ramparts were pulled down and the land was sold off before the area was converted into vineyards and Italian-style Renaissance gardens. Following the Swedish invasion of 1648, the gardens underwent restoration and their initially austere style received a Baroque makeover consisting of balustrade terraces with sculptures, monumental staircases and fountains.
- Wallenstein Garden (Valdštejnská zahrada)**
Prague 1, Letenská ulice
An early Baroque garden arranged in strictly geometric design, it was developed adjacent to the Wallenstein Palace in the years 1623–1629. The impressive Sala Terrena dominates the garden space, which also boasts other architectural elements such as a stallecotte Grotto, a fountain with a delicate bronze statue of Venus and a series of sculptures made by Adriaen de Vries (today's sculptures are bronze replicas; the original works were taken away by the Swedes at the end of the Thirty Years' War). In the summer the garden became a venue for concerts and theatre performances.
- Vrtba Garden (Vrtbovská zahrada)**
Prague 1, Karmelitská 25
A terraced garden recognized as a gem of garden architecture among Baroque gardens in Central Europe. It was developed in 1720 in conjunction with the Vrtbovský Palace according to a plan by architect František Maxmilián Kaňka on the site of a former vineyard. The area covers around 3,000 m², making it a relatively small historical garden. However, the original architectural design, which makes the best of the randomly profiled hillside compound and features masterpieces of artistic and historical value, places the garden among important landmarks in Europe. Its sculptures are the work of the renowned M. B. Braun.
- Petrín Orchards (Petrínské sady)**
Prague 1 – Hradčany, Malá Strana
Petrín hill belongs among the most extensive green areas in the city, with the lookout tower as its peak forming a distinctive feature on the city's skyline. In the Middle Ages, the sloped area was covered with vineyards and cultivated fields. There are several springs on Petřín; in the past they were diverted to the Pohorelec and the Lesser Town areas through a tunnel system, though today water is redirected down to Vltava river. Early in the 16th century, the orchards were completely recultivated and converted into the Lobkowitz Garden, Nebozizek, the Rose Garden, the Lookout Tower Park and the Seminary Garden.






Map of Prague
